Project finances as of June 30, 2023:

Due to the generous contributions of a long-time TNC supporter, we are nearing our goal of raising all of the funds necessary to complete the building of the Chindenga clinic.

- During the month, payments of \$23,037, \$19,710 and \$13,713 were made to the materials contractor. Of this, \$1650 was for steel fabrication, and \$1496 was for metal parts.
- Through the end of the month, TNC has wired a total of \$145,757 to project vendors.
- · A total of \$176,989 has been raised so far, with an additional \$143,692 needed to complete the project.
- · Work at Chindenga this month included electrical 2nd fix, glazing & painting of window frames, and floor tiling to Quadruple House. the skimming of internal walls, painting to internal & external walls, and electrical 2nd fix and welding of verandah steel poles was done to the OPD building. The installation of ceiling rhino boards, pouring of concrete slab, and electrical 1st fix and 1st fix plumbing was done to Maternity Delivery & Observation Ward building
- The Outpatient Department (OPD) is approximately 85% complete, the Quadruple Staff House is 90% complete, and the Maternity Ward is approximately 75% complete. Phase 2 is approximately 85% complete.
- · Work planned for next month includes:
- 1. Quadruple House- Floor & wall tiling, electrical second fix, plumbing second fix, door & ironwork fitting & general cleaning

- 2. OPD Building- Installation verandah poles & roof structure, painting of walls, floor & wall tiling, electrical second fix, plumbing second fix, door & ironwork fitting & general cleaning
- 3. Maternity Delivery & Observation Ward Building- Skimming of ceilings, painting walls, installation of verandah poles & roof structure and electrical second fix

Agricultural Program - Scott Sanford

- Equipment Sharing agreement signed June 27, 2023. The agreement and a modifications sheet will be sent to the TNC meeting minutes distribution email in early August. The modifications include:
- a. Mission will open a sub-account at the bank for farming activities managed by the Mission Centre Treasurer. The purpose is to hold all monies derived from use of equipment.
 - b. All proceeds to be used 100% at Nyadire mission
 - c. Repair costs will be funded from pooled fund in accounts.
 - d. In the event there aren't enough funds to cover repairs or purchases, all departments involved will be levied to cover costs.
 - e. The Station Chair will be responsible for management of the equipment sharing until a manager is appointed.
- · Agricultural equipment purchase Quotes received and purchases can proceed now that the equipment sharing agreement is in place.
 - a.2-Row maize Planter we have 2 quotes one for \$7980 (one left in stock) & one for \$10,500 (5-weeks after full payment)
 - b. Broadcast Spreader- \$3285 (one left in stock)

- c. Repair of Farm Department Tractor- \$800 Parts to repair an oil leak around the PTO shaft and a ball joint, plus oil and filters for scheduled maintenance. Work to be performed by the Mission Maintenance Department. In addition, the cost to rebuild/repair the fuel injection system is estimated at \$2000-\$2500. This is being finalized. All costs above include a 5% currency conversion fee.
- · GEP School Gardens Received an 86-page bulletin from Casper Jembere, Ag Instructor at Nyadire Teachers College. This was reviewed & comments returned for consideration.
- · Butchery- no activity as this was on hold until after field equipment is purchased.
