#### **Engineers Without Borders and Critical Vehicles**

Kevin Riley

- The CMU EWB team is focused on ways to keep Nyadire Hospital blood and medicines at required temperatures during extended power outages. A WhatsApp call between the team, Gashi Chikonyora and Dr. Larry provided a lot of information and support for this project. Refrigeration using special phase change materials looks to be the most promising solution at this point but options are still being explored. There are many formal steps in the EWB process required by National that hopefully can be completed in time to allow a team trip in May to Nyadire.
- A successful WhatsApp call with Christopher Kuwana allowed for a quick discussion on many Nyadire infrastructure items including the water system, hospital solar electricity and sadsa biogas stove fabrication. With parts still not available, there was no further progress on the few remaining repairs to two of the three hospital Land Cruisers deemed hospital critical by TNC. The third (the ambulance) should receive an extensive preventative maintenance and inspection in March with an estimate to maintain its reliability.

#### Eyeglasses

- Working on a long term storage and container solutions for the eyeglasses at the hospital

#### **Hearing Innovation**

- The Resource Unit for the Deaf at Nyadire Primary has 20 learners currently enrolled; 17 boarders and 3 day students. The program also supports 3 learners in the secondary program at Emerald Hill in Harare and 5 in the vocational program at Danhiko, also in Harare.
- On 15 February the Deaf learners at Nyadire Primary had a day trip to Dudley Hall program for the Deaf. Last term Dudley Hall students visited Nyadire. The day ended with a trip to a Lion Park and Snake World. "It was a good day indeed," says Simbarashe, the upper level teacher.
- Anticipating that Simbarashe and Evajoyce (lower level teacher) will take sign language refresher courses during break between terms. Funding will come from the UM Foundation Grant. Still waiting for quote for estimated cost.
- Second term fees will still include Emerald Hill as we have not been able to acquire the complete wiring information. Hopefully in the next trip the information can be obtained during an onsite visit.
- Other anticipated expenses from the Grant money include: bookshelves, cubbies, overhead projectors, Deaf career day, and a possible educational tour. A concern that none of the requested projects will be completed and the money will be forfeited.
- Hope to recruit a team of individuals with a background in Deaf education to join the next trip.
- An email with attached Lenten calendar was sent to sponsors and other supporters of the Hearing Innovation Program.

## Agriculture

- Crops at Nyadire are progressing well but a 3-week dry spell threatens yields
  - Home of Hope
    - Harvesting Tomatoes Dry weather has helped. People without irrigation do not have tomatoes so better market than normal.



- o Nyadire Ag Department
  - Concern about the dry weather
  - Starting transplants for garden Tomatoes, onions, vegetables
- Home of Hope grain storage / poultry barn
  - This project will use the unfinished poultry barn, completing half with 2 runs for poultry (broilers & laying hens) and half with 3 grain storage rooms and a room with the milling equipment which is now in a building behind the main HOH building
  - We have quotes for building construction, electrical work and a concrete pad for drying and threshing.





We are waiting for cost of poultry equipment before submitting proposal for funding. Current cost is \$23,430.

- GEP Garden project giving advice as required Soil test has been done low pH requires Liming Lime purchased and is to be applied
- Nyadire Poultry enterprise on-hold Edwin who is a ZimUMC conference Ag board member and Rep for Irvines indicated he would take the lead to steer the project.

- Elina Nyabote, HOH administrative assistant, is leading the **GEP program** for the HOH. She will divide GEP efforts between the few girls who are old enough for the program and the 13 children who are **bedwetters**. She will be making absorbent pads for those children in need. No update.

# **Rural Health Clinics**

Ralph Duckworth and Rev. Austern Chepiri (January report)

- The total project budget is \$350 680.58.
- No payments were made during the month; however, payments of \$38,666.39 were made during February to Halsted Brothers, J Mann, FFZ fencing, and the Consultant. To date, we have made payments of \$259,752 for the project.
- Work at Chindenga continued during the month and included finalizing Phase 2.3, which is now 100% completed. Work on Phase 3.1 continued during the month: the MCH Building is 98% complete, the Toilet Block is 92% completed, the Borehole is 60% completed and the Two-Family Staff House is 50% completed.
- To date, the local communities have delivered 170,000 farm bricks, 75 cubic meters of river sand, 65 cubic meters of stones, 250 cubic meters of gravel, and 185 cubic meters of pit sand to the project.
- Work planned for next month includes:
  - MCH Waiting Area general cleaning
  - Toilet Block
    - Electrical 2<sup>nd</sup> fix
    - Plumbing 2<sup>nd</sup> fix
    - Painting to internal & external walls
    - Tiling to walls and floors
    - General cleaning
  - Duplex Two-Bedroomed House

- Superstructure brickwork to wall plate/gable level
- Roofing
- Plastering of internal & external walls
- Borehole Drilling and Equipping
  - Excavation of trenches for water pipework reticulation
  - Installation of solar panels
- The project is proceeding nicely and should be completed by mid-2024.

#### Volunteers-in-Mission

- Flyer distributed announcing 2024 Mission Trips. I have received 2 emails from interested travelers/families. I have also shared the flyer with my ongoing email list of potential volunteers.
- I have been in communication with Kevin as he plans for the EWB Team Trip. We have discussed logistics and I will provide the Cultural Awareness Training to his group.

#### Other business

- Severe weather conditions in Zimbabwe
  - Nyadire has been affected by severe heat and drought, with crop yields and water levels suffering dramatically
  - TNC will remain in close contact with local leadership to assess conditions and consider any mitigation actions we can take/recommend
- Cholera outbreak
  - We've heard about an outbreak of cholera at one of the rural health clinics and will be in contact with local and government officials to assess the situation and determine if/how we can help
