Secretary Merit Award Received by Nyadire Primary! (Drew)

Nyadire Primary received the prestigious "Secretary Merit Award", a national award which the Ministry gives in recognition of excellence in the provision of education services. Several TNC-supported programs were instrumental in receipt of the award. According to Tendayi Mushapaidze states that the digester was an important contributor, but other factors include the coding club, the Girls Empowerment Pad program, as well as the COVID response and distribution of masks. The ceremony visitors from the ministry interviewed students in the coding club about the programming of the robots and were very impressed with their comprehensive responses. - Biogas Digester: (From Drew) No data sheets on operation of the digester have been received, but we did receive messages & photos from Tendayi Mushapaidze stating that the digester is "performing very well". Cattle have died from "January disease" throughout the mission, including the Primary School, which has limited where cow waste can be collected. The primary school is currently collecting waste from cattle at the teachers college for operation of the digester.
- Next Project: The CMU Chapter has been addressing EWB National's feedback on the Biogas Digester and continuing research on potential next projects.

Rural Clinic Renovations: Ralph Duckworth, Rev. Austern Chepiri

- The total project budget is \$350 680.58.
- Through the end of the month, TNC has wired a total of \$87,801 to project vendors.
- During the month, TNC received contributions totaling \$1,874 and have raised \$196,336 so far. The current account balance is \$78,535.
- Including the GBGM grant for the borehole, an additional \$154,345 is needed to complete the project.
- The United Methodist Foundation awarded a grant of slightly more than \$5,000 in June. This is not a matching grant.

- Work at Chindenga continued during the month and mostly concentrated on painting internal & external walls and the electrical 2nd fix to Quadruple House 1. In addition, the fabrication of timber trusses, roof covering, concrete slab, electrical 1st fix, plumbing 1st fix and plastering to internal & external walls was done to the Maternity Delivery & Observation Ward building.
- The Outpatient Department is approximately 70% completed, the Quadruple Staff House is 85% complete, and the Maternity Ward is approximately 65% complete. Phase 2 is approximately 75% completed.
- To date, the local communities have delivered 130,000 farm bricks, 50 cubic meters of river sand, 40 cubic meters of stones, 200 cubic meters of gravel, and 130 cubic meters of pitsand to the project.
- Work planned for next month includes:
 - Floor and wall tiling, electrical work, and plumbing of the quadruple staff house
 - Roof completion, painting, floor and wall tiling, and electrical work for the out patients building
 - Skimming of walls and ceiling, painting, and plumbing for the maternity ward

Agriculture Program Scott Sanford & Committee

- No meeting held in June
- Drafting letter to the Agricultural Director for Africa to see how we might work together.
- Current conditions at Nyadire Farm Department:
 - 1. Concrete slab has been constructed at the Farm Department to handle grain
 - 2. Chicken house under construction: Roofing in progress, to be completed by the end of June
 - 3. Electricity and water supplies are still not resolved; borehole needed to feed the poultry house

- 4. Intend to start a garden project with 1,000 cabbages and 1,000 tomato plants by August 1
- 5. Massey Ferguson working but currently needs servicing
- 6. Nursery of mango and lemon trees we intend to do budding and grafting of 900 plants 100 mangos and 100 lemons will be planted for Mission Farm and the remainder sold.
- 7. No activity at the butchery
- 8. Harvesting maize crop
- Home of Hope Farm
 - 1. Shelling maize
 - 2. Trenched and set on the poly pipes to insert the drip lines
 - 3. Will plant sugar beans, tomatoes, watermelons and cabbages
 - 4. The solar system has greatly enhanced water capacity. The water supply is very good and Emmanuel is confident the plants they are about to plant will "sail through".
- Equipment Sharing agreement.
 - Draft document revised and sent to Rev. Mukundu, Esnath and Emmanuel for further revisions/questions. Emmanuel states that he has reviewed in person with Esnath and they agreed with the document contents. Together with Rev. Mukundu their "pulled opinion" is favorable and they will sign the document.
 - Email received from from Rev. Mukundu: "Greetings. Sorry for the delayed response but this is great development, thank you! I think the whole idea will work out fine and I'm really in support of everything. Successful farming today calls for a mechanized farm program which I think will go a long way if these proposals are implemented."
 - Emmanuel states that he/they are working on getting answers to questions as to how to equitably fund or cover maintenance, repair and ownership costs.
- Agricultural equipment purchase on hold until equipment sharing agreement is finished.
- GEP School Gardens Working with Casper Jembere, Ag Instructor at Nyadire Teachers College

 GBGM - Kathleen Griffin introduced Scott to Kepi Lakoh, who is the Director of Agricultural Programs for Africa and based in Sierria Leone. Sent a letter to Kepi inquiring about the availability of funds for unfinished projects at Nyadire. Included in the letter is our long term vision of 400 hectares of cultivated land and asked if GBGM could be a funding partner to make the first center pivot irrigation system a reality.

Hospital Support Mark LaRosa, Dr. Larry Tanyanyiwa

- A very informative meeting was held on June 23, 2023 with Kathleen Griffith , Ralph Duckworth, Mark LaRossa, Sandy McKnight, Deborah Swineford and Leah Swineford in attendance.
- It was agreed that TNC and GBGM should work more closely together to support Nyadire. GBGM can provide material resources, while TNC, through our relationship with folks at Nyadire, can provide a lens of sustainability and implementation.
- Another meeting will be scheduled after some follow up work to be completed by Kathy.
