Ingomar Living Waters

- Andy Fraley and Marianne Chatham from Ingomar Living Waters met via zoom with TNC leadership regarding their non-profit that funds boreholes.
- Their main criteria is that they work in places where lives are at risk due to lack of clean water.
- They raise funds through a Christmas offering at Ingomar UMC and also at an annual fundraiser held in April, "Turning Wine into Water" where borehole projects are "auctioned" and donors can bid on funding the project.
- TNC November VIM team to evaluate water needs at rural clinics and outreach school locations.

<u>Eyeglasses Program Natalie Geer, Gashirai Chikonyora</u> ZIM Side:

- \$1480.03 was sent via World Remit to Emmanuel for Christopher's repair of the Farm Department Tractor. This includes oil and filter change, new air filter, seal for PTO shaft, tie rod end, fuel injector pump and rebuilt injectors.

Report through <u>September</u>, 2023:

- The total project budget is \$350 680.58
- Year to date, \$162,495 (preliminary) wired to project vendors.
- · We believe that as a result of our "Moonshot" efforts, we have raised enough funds to complete the clinic awaiting confirmation of receipt of pledged funds.

Preliminary September financial data:

- Balance beginning of the month \$35,495
- Contributions for the month \$ 1,216
- Disbursements for the month \$ 5,185 (contractor labor costs)
- Balance end of the month \$31,526
- · Work at Chindenga continued during the month and included finalizing Phase 2.3. The Quadruple Staff House and the OPD Building are 100% complete and the Maternity Delivery & Observation Ward building is 98% complete. Work on Phase 3.1 began during the month: the MCH Building, the Borehole and the Toilet Block are 50% complete and the Two-Family Staff House is 15% complete.
- Reviewed and approved a detailed budget plan for Phase 3.1 of the project as prepared by Conference Officers. Phase 3.1 is slated to be completed by 30th December at a budgeted cost of \$66,000 exclusive of the borehole, which is being funded by GBGM. Phase 3.1 will focus on the MCH Waiting Area, Toilet Block, Two-Family Staff Housing, and the Borehole.
- · Work planned for October includes completion of the Maternity Ward and continuation of Phase 3.1 work:

MCH Waiting Area: Plastering to internal & external walls

Toilet Block: Plastering to internal & external walls

Duplex Two-Bedroomed House: Pouring concrete footing and sub-structure

brickwork

Borehole Drilling and Equipping: Construction of borehole pump room, fabrication of solar panel stand structure and excavation of trenches for water pipework reticulation

• The local communities have delivered 150,000 farm bricks, 75 cubic meters of river sand, 65 cubic meters of stones, 250 cubic meters of gravel, and 170 cubic meters of pit sand to the project.
