Review of TNC Financials: Karen Cahall, Treasurer

Karen was unavailable for the meeting, but had forwarded the August Final and September Preliminary financials plus the expenditures made in August and to date in September.

<u>Rutendo Mavunga</u>, a Zimbabwean college student studying economics at Allegheny College (north of Pittsburgh, PA) was introduced at the meeting. Bishop Cynthia Moore Koi-Koi had suggested she contact TNC.

While at Allegheny College, Rutendo formed Batanai, a non-profit organization focused on helping girls and women deal with the adverse effects of climate change. The organization has raised approximately \$15,000 in funding so far and seeks additional funds from three sources: donations through a yet-to-be completed website, grants, and proceeds from handmade bags made in Zimbabwe.

Ways in which Batanai and TNC can work together will be explored.

Clinic Renovation Program Ralph Duckworth, Rev. Austern Chepiri Report through August 2023:

- The total project budget is \$350 680.58.
- \$1,130 was paid to the consultant for supervisory services.
- · A total of \$157,310 has been wired to project vendors.
- · Contributions for the month totaled \$13,141.
- · Although the amounts are not yet final, we believe that as a result of our "Moonshot" efforts, we have raised enough funds to complete the clinic.
- Work at Chindenga continued during the month and concentrated on completing the final components of the Quadruple House (100% complete), the OPD building (100% complete), and the Maternity Delivery & Observation Ward building (93% complete.)
- · Conference officials provided a detailed budget plan for Phase 3 of the project for review.
- To date, local communities have delivered 145,000 farm bricks, 75 cubic meters of river sand, 65 cubic meters of stones, 250 cubic meters of gravel, and 165 cubic meters of pitsand to the project.
- · Work planned for next September includes completion of the Maternity Ward and commencement of work on the MCH Waiting Area, the second Staff House, and the Toilet Block Building.
